

## What is CalStateTEACH?

CalStateTEACH is a California State University teacher education program for prospective teachers needing to complete a multiple subject credential. Using the latest technology including the Internet, CD-ROM, video, and print materials, CalStateTEACH delivers high quality education to individuals across California.

## How Does It Work?

Prospective teachers work in small groups guided by CSU faculty. Faculty visit the classroom to observe teaching and offer feedback and support. Students and faculty communicate through the program's website and e-mail. A study guide presents activities that integrate course assignments with hands-on teaching. The curriculum is integrated and completely school-based, with no separate courses taken on campus. Access to a computer with an Internet connection is required.

- \$55 application fee (subject to change)
- two letters of recommendation
- official transcripts (unofficial copies or fax OK to start the process)
- CBEST and CSET scores
- autobiographical writing sample

CalStateTEACH offers both intern and traditional teacher preparation (student teaching) options. Here are some quick facts:

<b>Start Dates</b>	Fall, Spring, Summer
<b>Application Deadline</b>	Applicants are encouraged to apply early. See website for deadlines, application and further details.
<b>Basic Requirements</b>	Bachelor's degree, CBEST, CSET, two letters of recommendation, 2.75 GPA in last 60 semester units or 2.67 cumulative GPA. (Some special admits below 2.67 GPA.)
<b>Program Length &amp; Hours</b>	Minimum 16 months on the year-round calendar. Approximately 15 hours per week of independent study time in addition to normal preparation time for teaching are required. Five full-day Saturday seminars are also required.
<b>Eligibility</b>	Candidates eligible for the intern option must be teaching in a multiple subject classroom in which the core curriculum (language arts, social studies, math, and science) is taught to all students. Candidates in the traditional teacher preparation option will be placed in appropriate multiple subject settings for field experience and student teaching.
<b>CSET</b>	If you are CSET qualified, you will be admitted officially into our program's 15-week Stage One. If you are not CSET qualified, you are enrolled in our prerequisite 30-week Split Stage One. You will concurrently be enrolled in our prerequisite CSET preparation course providing you with the online support needed to successfully pass the CSET. You must pass CSET to move on to Stage Two.
<b>Cost</b>	State University Fee for CSU credential candidates plus instructional materials fee. Refer to our website ( <a href="http://www.calstateteach.net/costs.html">www.calstateteach.net/costs.html</a> ) for current program cost.
<b>Financial Aid</b>	Individuals who are CSET qualified can apply online at <a href="http://www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a> . Apply early. Processing takes 6-8 weeks.
<b>Units Earned</b>	40 semester units.
<b>Special Features</b>	School-based teacher preparation. Convenient. Can be completed anywhere in California. No campus-based classes to attend. Provides a unique teacher preparation opportunity by integrating educational theory with daily hands-on classroom teaching. Curriculum designed for self-directed learners comfortable with Web-supported instruction.
